## Notes from your WVTA President – Spencer Capier

#### Dear Colleagues,

Happy December! Thank goodness report cards are done. We've heard a lot (a LOT!) of feedback from you about the **New Reporting Order**. The WVTA intends to create a more formal survey instrument to gather feedback on your experience writing report cards this fall.

The anecdotal feedback has been clear: there are a lot of wrinkles to iron out. Not least is the kludgy nature of MyEd. Additionally, many of you report being urged to write considerably longer comments, resulting in hours and hours of extra work. We've heard several other issues, and we'll offer members more focussed feedback through a survey, early in the new year.

The majority of the blame for the difficult report card season should be placed on the Ministry of Education and Child Care. The ministry gave little direction to districts, gave little thought to how their new approach to reporting would work with existing legacy software, and gave little time to roll it out. Stakeholders in our district have been trying to make the transition as smooth as possible.

Your union is regularly voicing your concerns to management and governance about the NRO and working with District Leadership to improve your experience next round of reporting. My hope is that things will be better in term two.

#### Professional Development

As we announced earlier this year, members now have access to a Major Conference Fund of up to

\$2000 every five years. Additionally, members can

now roll over their \$350 yearly allowance for up to three years.

We've heard a few questions from you:

- Can I access the roll over amount now and not access my yearly funds for two years in the future? No. We are not a bank.
- Can I combine the yearly Pro D funds and the Major Conference Fund? Yes! That could be up to \$3050 (\$2000 MCF + \$350 x 3 years)!
- How quick is the turnaround for Pro D applications? It depends. The review of applications to the Major Conference Fund may take a several weeks. The President, Vice President, and ProD Chair meet to assess applications and this usually occurs monthly. Don't apply the week before a conference! The approval process for the regular ProD fund with potential funding up to \$350, takes less time. Allow for several weeks as the office can be inundated with a stack of applications, and it can take a while to process.
- How do I get the cheque if my application is approved? Via the District Pony. That can take a while. We are not set up for electronic deposit.
- What are the criteria for the two ProD funds? Go to <u>WVTA.ca</u> for more details.

#### Sick Leave:

I wish our collective agreement had a provision that allowed members to take paid leave for medical appointments. The BCGEU has the provision of two hours paid leave for medical appointments, for example. **WE DO NOT.**  What does this mean? You should schedule regular medical appointments outside of work hours. The employer has in the past been reasonable about specialist appointments. You do not need to share private medical information.

In view of this, be aware that HR might question you about a sick day or half sick day booked in advance.

As we approach another round of bargaining you may want to make paid leave for medical appointments a priority when surveyed by the provincial union - I know I will.

#### Winter Break:

On that cheery note, I wish you all a well-earned rest over the holiday season. The break starts late this year, but I don't mind a stretch of days off in January as a gentle entry to the new year. I hope you take time for yourself as well as time with family and friends. Teaching can be all consuming, so it's good to be well and truly away from it when school is not in session.

## Salary Indemnity Plan

You may be eligible to save about 1.50% of your salary.

**Why?** Because you are no longer entitled to longterm disability benefits under the Salary Indemnity Plan (SIP) when you attain any of the following milestones:

- 35 years of contributory service, with a minimum age of 55
- Age 61, if you reach "Factor 90" before age 61.
- "Factor 90" if you are between ages 61 and 65.
- Age 65

Ensure that in the event of serious illness or accident you have sufficient accumulated sick leave, which, when combined with 120 days of benefits from SIP short-term, will protect your salary to the end of the month in which you meet one of the above milestones.
