Notes from your President – Spencer Capier

Hello Colleagues,

I am probably the fiftieth person in the district to welcome you back, but I'll do it anyway: Welcome Back! I hope you are ready for another school year.

Also: Welcome new teachers and new members to your union! I look forward to getting to know you all this coming year.

Here are several things your WVTA is focussed on this coming year:

New Reporting Order: The WVTA feels the district is avoiding several of the pitfalls the NRO could present, and that is to the good. Our concern is workload, of course.

Please let your Staff Reps know if you feel the expectations at your work site are unreasonable and are not consistent with the rest of the district nor the clear intention of ministry documents.

Non-Enrolling Ratios: This is always an issue at the start of the year. September is when enrolment data is not fully collated, many students have not been identified as needing more support, and it's easy to begin to feel overwhelmed. Please monitor class composition and caseloads and let your Staff Reps know if you see issues developing. The WVTA can bring concerns directly to upper management, and push for change if it's needed.

Bargaining: Holy Cow, already?! We would normally not be focussing on this for a few more months but the BCTF Bargaining Conference was moved up six months earlier than normal to this coming Spring.

If you are interested in participating in the bargaining process by being a member of the Bargaining

Committee, please let me or **Chantalle Wigley** (your Vice President) know. A Bargaining Chair will soon be appointed by your Representative Assembly. The WVTA will survey members to determine bargaining priorities and those priorities will be brought to a General Meeting for approval.

I believe the Provincial table's priorities will be on class size and composition language. I hope we see stronger language in this area, much as we saw last round with maternity leave provisions.

Professional Development Funds: Your Representative Assembly is considering changes to how Pro D funds are disbursed. Many of you have asked if Pro D funds could be rolled over from one year to the next. We are therefore looking at allowing funds to be rolled over for up to three years for a total accumulation of \$1050. Additionally, there may be the development of a Conference Fund of 20 grants of \$2000 per year. Many have also asked if Pro D funds could be applied to for credit course work. This last item would require consultation with the district.

The shift from Department Coordinators to Teacher Leaders continues. The WVTA has successfully consulted with the district on a mutually agreeable job description of the new Position of Special Responsibility (POSR). There will be further consultation on the method of appointment, and negotiation of the annual allowance. Our current annual allowance for Department Coordinators is one of the few examples of superior language in our Collective Agreement compared to most other school districts. The WVTA does not see why that should change.

The WVTA will provide opportunities for members to provide fulsome in person input on the new POSR in the coming weeks.

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Our first General Meeting of the year is September 21st at 3:45 at the Kay Meek. You will hear a 'state of the union,' and be given an opportunity to discuss and approve the proposed budget for the year. There will be lavish door prizes and a wine and cheese social to follow. I look forward to seeing you there!

Lots going on! Remember, teaching is a marathon, not a sprint; pace yourselves!

All other Pro-D days will be school-based, which will hopefully provide an opportunity for all members to have more self-directed options for your professional development. The school reps and I will be meeting at the end of September to discuss some exciting,

proposed changes to the WVTA Pro-D Funding program, and my hope is to be a consistent and helpful support as they plan school-based days. Please feel free to reach out to me any time if you have any questions or would like to chat.

WVTA Professional Development Fund: QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

Q: What is the WVTA Pro-D Fund?

A: The Pro-D fund is a trust fund administered by the Association, primarily the WVTA office with direction from the Pro-D Committee chair and the WVTA president. The fund receives an annual contribution from the Board based on a formula in our contract, and a Teacher on Call pool of up to 120 days is allocated annually for Professional Development purposes. The Association makes an annual contribution of \$8000 to the fund.

The School Effectiveness Fund no longer exists! This program was discontinued several years ago with its previously designated monies incorporated into the ProD Fund, also based on a formula in the contract.

Q: What is my allotment?

A: Any teacher with an assignment in the district, including part-time teachers and teachers on leave, is eligible for up to \$350 funding and two TOC days per school year (one day for .4 FTE and under). Non-enrolling teachers **who do not require TTOC coverage** are eligible for up to \$500 of funding per school year, and TTOCs employed by the district are eligible for up to \$150 of funding per school year.

Q: Can I get TTOC coverage for day-in lieu, or be paid by the fund if I attend a Pro-D event or collaboration on a non-working day?

A: TTOC coverage will not be approved for a day in lieu. Much of the Professional Development teachers undertake is scheduled during non-teaching hours or days (including evenings, weekends, summers). The special program offered last year for paid collaboration time on non-teaching days may be repeated this year. More information on this program will be coming soon!

Q: Where can I find the WVTA Pro-D Fund Application Form?

Q: Can I have my Pro-D funding paid directly to the conference or event I am attending?

A: We prefer to make payments directly to the person who has applied for the funding to simplify the accounting records for audit process. For a group of teachers paying a special group fee, each teacher should submit an individual application form for their share of cost.
